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SOME INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE YOU START:

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- 1) Wedge very well at least 800g of clay. You will not use it all, but you will need to open more than you're gonna use tough.
- 2) This is a slab building technique project in which I used 5mm thickness guide strips for all the parts.
- 3) The template was developed to be printed on an A4 paper size. There is just one thing you need to pay attention while printing, which is to select the "actual size" option, otherwise you will lose the real size of the project (if you select the "fit to printable area" option, for example, the scale of the project will be reduced).
- 4) Follow the template tutorials available online on YouTube channel (@ceramicsfromhome). The specific links are pinned in the product description (ceramics from home website).
- 5) Choose the glazes that best reflect your mood. You can also decorate it with some underglazes and/or overglazes. It's all upon your creativity!
- 6) Always remember to use healthcare equipment such as mask, apron and gloves while playing with ceramics, just as important as cleaning up your workplace keeping it out of dust as much as possible to prevent silicosis - a very delicate lung disease - and other health issues.
- 7) If you are in a position to set up a home studio and you can have an exclusive room for making pottery, that's an amazing goal for you to avoid spreading ceramics products dust throughout the rest of the house. Either way, the apron and the cleanliness obsession will be good friends to you. I believe that our body is the most amazing machine ever made that deserves to be cared of. Think about it and try to protect yourself and your loved ones as much as you can. Health and safety always come first!
- 8) Feel free to play with this project and make your own tests, changing it as much as you want. I believe that play with clay is a truly magical world you should cross through. So, the templates that I create are just the first step forward on it. You only cannot commercialize the templates themselves but you surely can sell the pottery pieces that you hand-build from them. I'll always be here to encourage you on your entrepreneurship journey. Count on me!

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1) Wedge very well the clay.



2) Open the clay using some guide strips for slab building technique. I'm using 5mm thickness strips.



3) Transfer the template to the clay and cut it out.



4) Put your stamp on the back of the base.



5) Score both sides for better attachment.



6) Apply slip to both parts.



7) Join the parts.



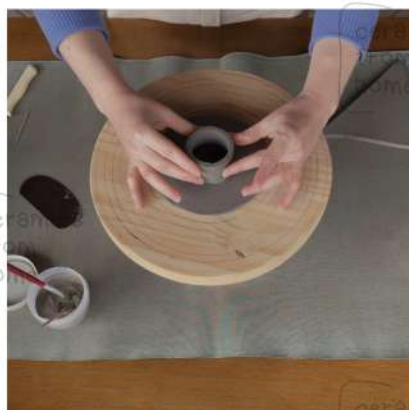
8) Mark the center.



9) Score both parts for better attachment.



10) Apply slip to both parts.



11) Attach inner wall to base.



12) Fold the edges of the base inward.



13) Make a coil for better attachment.



14) Use the tools you like the most to press the coil against the parts.



15) I like to finish this step with my fingers.



16) Soften the edges.



17) Pinch the edges a bit to make them even thinner.



18) Create waves along the edges randomly.



19) Do the same to the inner part.



20) Let it dry slowly before the bisque firing.

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
